

Growing character

Begin conversations with others and start asking questions



Adapt to social situations, becoming more aware of boundaries and effect of behaviour on others



Understanding & listening

Understand and laugh at jokes

Listen and respond to conversation and instructions

Use language (lots of new words!) and long sentences to create storylines or...



...imaginative play

Moving with confidence

Use simple tools and try out new ways of moving



Use more complex toys



Start to perform care tasks themselves, like washing hands or dressing

More personal awareness when trying out new things or movements

Use a dominant hand and form recognisable letters

Ask questions about their environment. And show they care about the world around them.

Start to understand computers



Increased interest in shapes and how they work

Numbers & shapes

$$2+1=3$$

Greater understanding of numbers and their meaning

Songs, stories & play

Become interested in building new materials out of craft materials, play with textures and use tools for a purpose

Remember events from their own life through drawing, painting or creating

Create stories with their toys

Sing a few songs of their own or tap out a familiar rhythm

Recognise letters as they read and draw

Ask questions and express interest in problems

Look at books independently, recalling main events and characters
